Specialized Children's Equipment

YOUR GIFT OF COMMUNICATION HELPS BREAK NEW BARRIERS

Generous donors gave children a voice.

Communicating with family and friends is something many of us take for granted. For non-verbal children and youth, this skill is critical to enhancing their ability to be active and engaged participants in their family, school and community.

Thanks to incredible donors, including **TELUS** and **The Winnipeg Foundation**, the Rehabilitation Centre for Children's Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) Program has taken a giant step forward.





The AAC program follows a crucial and structured process which ensures a child's eligibility is compatible with Eye Gaze equipment. This leading-edge technology detects what a child is trying to communicate through eye tracking and movement.

To ensure this equipment is the right option, a child will embark on a 10-week trial period. During this time they will learn and practice using this remarkable technology. Generous donors have provided two Eye Gaze devices which are being used for the trials. This is helping increase the number of kids being assessed and providing opportunities for children to use their voices.

You made this innovative technology a reality, enabling children and youth with complex needs to communicate their thoughts, expressions and desires effectively.



YOUR GENEROSITY PROVIDED INDEPENDENCE.

Bike-riding dreams became reality.

You have enriched Sebastian's life. This delightful five-year-old with an infectious smile had a special dream fulfilled last year. You made it possible for Sebastian to experience the sense of independence his peers enjoy.

Sebastian and other children living with disabilities often require customized and adapted bikes to meet their individual needs. Thanks to your generous donations, the Foundation was able to fund more than 50 bikes in 22/23.

Your generosity enabled the investment of over \$200,000 toward new bikes.

Sebastian is having a great time riding his handcycle and exploring his neighbourhood. He has never moved so quickly on his own, and he remarked to his parents "Look at me, I'm just like Mario Cart on TV." Your investment has provided Sebastian with mobility, independence, improved health and fun.

The physical, therapeutic and social benefits of bikes are tremendous.

Adapted Recreational Programs

TRANSFORMATIVE GRANT ENHANCED THERAPEUTIC **POSSIBILITIES**

Adapted musical instruments stimulate positive response.



A generous grant from MusiCounts TD Community Music Program provided a tremendous boost to the L.I.F.E. Music Therapy Program.

This significant grant was instrumental in acquiring specially adapted musical instrument's for children and youth living with physical and/or cognitive disabilities, heralding a new era of therapeutic possibilities.

Gabriel has always had a strong love for music. Until now though he has never had the tools accessible to expand his love into creation and participation.

"An instrument or drum kit that is modified enough so focus can be on learning to make music, becomes the difference between participating and observing. While great things can be learned through observation, we are already living in a world where those living with disabilties are expected to observe, rather than participate. Modified instruments and access to them, makes music a part of our life." - Vanéssa, Gabriel's Mom

With this transformative grant, the L.I.F.E. Music Therapy program now has a wide variety of specially adapted musical instruments. This includes adapted percussion instruments, customized keyboards and string instruments with alternative access options such as switches, padded surfaces, and modified finger boards. Youth are creating music in their own unique ways and having fun throughout the three seasons of programming. Our dedicated Music Therapist leads them on a musical journey which helps address physical, psychological, cognitive and social needs.

YOUR SUPPORT EMPOWERED DREAMS

L.I.F.E. programming provided an inclusive and welcoming space.

Garrett (pictured below) is a smiley upbeat 15-year-old who has been attending the L.I.F.E. Program's summer camp for the past four years. Camp, funded exclusively by donors, allows him to participate in adapted recreational programs where "there are other kids like me." His family is very grateful for your generosity, as camp provides a fun and safe opportunity for Garrett to enjoy independence.





The vital program enables children and youth living with physical and developmental disabilities to participate in a parent-free week of camp filled with their favourite activities! Your tremendous support fulfilled dreams and filled an essential program gap.

All campers are provided with a trained one-on-one support worker to help ensure this inclusive and fun environment is as comfortable as possible for both children and parents.

Your gift helped youth feel included and accepted in a supportive community which empowers and promotes skill development, including self-esteem and confidence. The various activities offered campers memorable experiences and gave them the resources to improve their physical, emotional and social wellbeing.

You contributed to amazing memories being shared with their peers.



Clinical Programs & Services

THEIR AMAZING CONTRIBUTION IS LIFE ALTERING Thank you for the gift of independence.

An exceptionally generous donation from Robert (Bob) and Marnie Puchniak enabled the expansion of a tremendously important program last year. On Time Mobility, led by RCC therapists and engineers (formerly Early Powered Mobility), provides young children with the ability to move independently using modified powered vehicles, manual equipment and adaptive switches.

A fully supported program was a RCC dream which the Puchniak investment made a reality. A fleet of powered vehicles like Wizzybugs, Bugzi and Permobile Explorer Minis were purchased. These devices assist in teaching driving skills to very young children as a precursor to using an electric wheelchair.

"This generous donation provided our program with an incredible opportunity to get young children moving at the same time as their peers in age-appropriate powered mobility devices. Kids are joyful and a gateway to their future independence has been opened.

As RCC staff, we often get to see the beautiful firsts in our families lives, and this donation has provided many of those firsts. The first time moving by yourself, the first time running your siblings over, the first-time playing tag, and so many more wonderful moments. Having multiples of the devices has been invaluable and allows for loans so children can practice their skills at home where they are most comfortable."

Clinical Programs & Services

DONOR GIFT ADVANCED DELIVERY OF ORTHOTICS & PROSTHETICS

New equipment streamlines clinical processes.

Technological advancement has transformed the landscape of orthotics and prosthetics, bringing a new era of efficiency, comfort and enhanced support for children living with disabilities. A Peel 3D scanner and new industrial sewing machine were funded by a generous Manitoba Street Rod Association contribution.

The scanner ensures children received their orthotics quickly and with more ease. Traditionally, the process of crafting orthotics and prosthetics involved time-consuming and uncomfortable hand-casting methods, particularly burdensome for young people.





The new technology allows for comprehensive, high-precision scans which are digitally transmitted, expediting production of orthotic devices.


The digital template allows skilled technicians to tailor orthotics to the unique needs of each child, such as designing a specialized back brace for those with scoliosis. The speed and turnaround time of this technology is remarkable. The scanning process now takes a quick 20 minutes, is easier and more comfortable for the children.

A state-of-the-art sewing machine, equipped with a specialized arm and table, allows technicians to swiftly make in-house adjustments to shoes and boots, ensuring a perfect fit for braces and orthotics. Each year hundred of pairs of shoes and boots are modified for many children. Children and youth are experiencing greater mobility and walking with confidence as they navigate their environment with greater ease.



EXCITING RESEARCH PROJECT FOSTERS PARTICIPATION

Adapted controller provides an inclusive experience.



Your support for research provides the Rehabilitation Centre for Children's Research Team with the ability to collaborate with local, national and international researchers. Research is critical to advancing the clinical experience, treatments and adapted equipment and technology that help improve the lives of children and youth.

An exciting research project in the development stage features the RCC team collaborating on the feasibility to create adapted gaming controllers. Some children's physical disabilities limit their ability to play video games with friends and family. This research has helped advance a prototype which allows children and youth with disabilities the opportunity to participate fully.

Staff Development

RCC staff are leaders and experts in their fields. Your donations enable them to be exemplary service providers and supported valuable professional development last year.

Therapists attended the American Academy of Cerebral Palsy and Developmental Medicine and the knowledge acquired has been integrated into programming in these fundamental areas. RCC team members also attended the Assistive Technology Industry Association conference which was instrumental in learning more about eye gaze technology and current assessment approaches.


